The Water Is Now Flowing In Tanzania!

In the October 2018 issue of the newsletter, you read *"New Water Well Needed in Tanzania."* On "Giving Tuesday," November 27, the need for the well was highlighted as a priority, and Teleios partners responded.

In less than three months, the water is flowing! The vision of a new well at the Bread of Life Secondary School has become a reality.



This new well will provide water to the school and the Daily Bread Life Children's Home farm. The addition of this new source of water will now allow the DBLCH farm well to supply water for the local communities and the farm in the Kidete area. Currently, people from three villages come to get clean drinking water from the DBLCH farm well. The

next closest source of consistent water is almost five kilometers away.

We have also learned more great news - Fisher Middle School in Greenville, S.C., is having a Walk for Water on April 4 that will help provide needed funds for the pump, tank and piping for the new well.

This is so exciting – exciting for the villages and the schools in Kidete and Greenville! We serve an amazing God.

Hands-On Participation Provides Opportunity For Greater Understanding

In January, Floyd and Bonnie Parker traveled to Kenya with teams from Sunbelt Marketing in Atlanta and Kenny Pipe in Nashville. Members of these teams came from various locations around the country where his/her company has branches, as well as the corporate headquarters.

These companies have partnered with Teleios for several years helping provide water to the semi-arid district of Keini West, located in Nyeri County.

The team from Sunbelt Marketing was in-country from January 18-26. The team from Kenny Pipe followed and was there Jan. 26-Feb. 2.

Employees had an opportunity to see what their companies have provided and got to put their hands to work with the projects.

Working alongside Kenyan partners, team members dug trenches, laid pipe, covered trenches and participated in connecting the taps for six homes to have running water for the very first time. Some of these residents had waited years for this day!

We were a part of history as water flowed to these homes! Blessings from the Spirit of the Living Water also flowed forth into the lives of every participant!

Each team also helped build a new house for two families in the Shalom area. The Shalom Church, under the leadership of pastor Robert Muteithia, selected the families based on need. Each of the old dwellings had to be torn down and removed before construction on the new structures could begin.

After each week of extreme physical labor, the teams were able to rest and enjoy a safari.





Sunbelt Marketing Team members started early each day with shovels in hand as they prepared to dig trenches and cover them once the pipes were laid. Of course, not all terrain was equal and working around thorny Acacia trees and shrubs became a norm.

At the end of the week, though, witnessing the pure joy on faces of the children when water flowed from the tap made it all worth it.

Tanzania Trip Was Time For Reflection, Planning

As the last team departed Kenya, Floyd and Bonnie Parker flew to Iringa, Tanzania, to spend eight days with Mpeli and Neema Mwaisumbe and the Daily Bread Life Ministry family.

The week was filled with planning sessions and visits with the children at Daily Bread Life and Asante Sana Children's Homes, and Bread of Life Secondary School. In addition to all of this, visits were made to the business ventures, like the Café, the garage, and Masoko Tours Safari Co., which were established to provide jobs and income for our young adults.

DBLCH is filled with lots of new, young children, again. The days were filled with laughter and song as we spent time on the campus loving those we already knew and learning new faces to love. It is such a blessing watching as some of the first residents of DBLCH, such as Allen and Teresea, now participate as staff.

The last of those who originally came as orphans to DBLCH are now in Form 3 at Bread of Life Secondary School. Others are away at college, vocational schools, while some have graduated and are now in the workforce.

Leonard, one of the original children, has started the process for getting married. He is engaged and negotiations for a dowry are under way with a projected wedding date in January of 2020. My, how time has flown!

The children at Asante Sana are growing up, as well. Esau, the oldest at age 13, is now enrolled in a boarding school that teaches trades. He is studying to be a builder. The other children are all healthy and happy.

The Asante Sana staff is doing a wonderful job. It is our hope to be able at some point in the future to move the children from the village school to a school that will provide a higher quality education for them.

One afternoon was spent at Bread of Life Secondary School with Headmaster Pawdre Scout, teachers and staff. What a wonderful team they are! There is such a spirit of unity and cooperation among them and the students are thriving in this atmosphere.

There are currently 110 students enrolled this new school year. We shared some time with them. Due to abundant rainfall in the area, the campus was beautiful with green grass, colorful plants and trees in full bloom!

On Sunday, we worshipped at Kidete Church and ACTS Fellowship, Iringa. We were blessed to participate with our brothers and sisters in Christ and share in the Lord's Supper. Both churches are growing and reaching members of their respective communities with the Gospel message of Jesus Christ.

The DBLCH farm is doing very well under the management of Andecille (Alex). This growing season was a harvest of tomatoes large enough to sell at the market. In addition to the tomatoes, spinach from last growing season's harvest, eggs, milk and pork have provided some provisions for the school and children's homes, as well as a small income for the work of DBL.

In one of our three meetings, we took a look at the 2018 finances. Each year, Daily Bread Life Ministry has an independent, outside audit conducted. A clean financial audit was returned. We took inventory of what is needed financially throughout this year.

A list of priorities was compiled for the days ahead. Plans for 2019 and 2020 were laid out. Dates were set for a Children's Bible Camp to be held again this year. The trip dates for this camp are June 6-June 16.

We spent time in prayer with Neema and Mpeli thanking God for partnership blessings and asking His guidance and wisdom for the future.

God has worked mightily through the DBLCH/Teleios/Kip and Kim Miller and the Eastern family over the years. Much has been accomplished during that time. Only God knows the future. We look forward with excitement and eager anticipation as He reveals His work for us in the days to come!

Pray for Fidelis' friends, the church and the village as they cope with losing him.**

Reflections From the Green Chair.....

Two anniversaries happened during the past couple of weeks. Twenty-five years ago, Bonnie and I went on our first international mission trip to Kenya. It was there that God gave us the vision for Teleios Ministry.

Twenty years ago, I was lying in bed praying through Acts 20:24. For 10 years, that passage had been on display in my office, first at First Baptist Church in Ware Shoals, then at Augusta Road Baptist Church in Greenville. The verse had become a life verse for me. On this night, the verse came alive; it took on a whole different meaning.

The next day, I was going to have a "rotor router" procedure to clear up the "widow maker" blockage in my left anterior descending artery (LAD) feeding my heart. I had grown up with my father having heart issues (two open heart surgeries and more heart attacks than I could remember). To me, the worst thing in all the world was heart issues. Now, here I was facing a heart procedure.

I prayed that night, "*Lord, if there is anything, any one thing that I have not finished that you have for me, let me finish.*" Then, I prayed, "*I consider my life worth nothing to me; my only aim is*

to finish the race and complete the task the Lord Jesus has given me – the task of testifying to the good news of God's grace." (Acts 20:24). When the procedure was over, my prayer did not change, but the focus of my life did.

Just to flash back, Bonnie and I had decided that when we were 55 years old we would "retire" early and focus on Teleios Ministry (its name now, only a vision then). I was 44 years old when the heart challenge helped me see where God was leading and the one thing that He had for us. Teleios Ministry was born.

As I look back on my own life and as I work with others with God-given visions, I realize that most of the time getting started on the vision was born out of struggle – a life moment. You come to point where you say, "*God, it's not about me, it's about what You are doing. I just want to do what You have prepared for me. I want to fulfill the purpose of my life – I want to finish what You put in my hands to do.*"

Now 20 years later, I look at all that God had prepared for Bonnie and me and all those He brought into our lives and all those whose visions He brought into our lives. Never did we dream or envision all

that God has done, led us through, led us to, and allowed us to be a part. Never did we dream of all the lives, all the people whose lives have been changed by His grace.
